For those who haven't had the good fortune of seeing Marc in person, he has written *George Washington's Unsung Heroes: He Couldn't Have Done it Without Them. The Men and Women Who Helped Win the American Revolution*. Directed to kids from age 11-18, it tells the stories of our country's first heroes, known and lesser known. In a very few pages for each person,
